QUICK FACTS

CARE COORDINATION

- The Care Coordination Unit assisted 11,640 individuals with various needs, including casework, information & assistance, money management, Medicare Part D enrollment, and caregiver needs.
- Adult Protective Services provided 743 elder abuse interventions.

An Adult Protective Services client had a case of financial exploitation that also turned into self-neglect. Though she had health care aids that came in daily, she was experiencing problems with break-ins and was non-compliant with taking medication. Her caseworker was able to get her place in a local nursing home, and with the help of IATP, Money Management, and Senior Transport, she now has a safe living environment.

ELDER ASSISTANCE SERVICES

• 639 seniors received Elder Assistance services, and 170 emergency food orders were provided.

A gentleman contacted Senior Services after receiving an eviction notice due several months of unpaid rent. To his knowledge, his rental payments were scheduled to automatically deduct from his checking account. After speaking with his bank and the management staff of the home he resides in, we learned that a majority of the money owed was still in his account. We were able to help him make up the difference along with all penalties accumulated, and he was able to stay in his home. He is greatly relieved of the stress of wondering if and when he might be set out.

NUTRITION

- The Daily Bread Program provided 136,634 meals to 1,339 seniors.
- Springfield Specialty Meals on Wheels provided 14,401 meals to 108 seniors.

SENIOR TRANSPORT

• Senior Transport provided 11,983 rides to 330 seniors and individuals with disabilities.

VOLUNTEERS

• 274 Volunteers served 11,811.994 hours at Senior Services of Central Illinois, delivering meals to homebound seniors, assisting with programs and activities, providing money management services, and providing a friendly call to socially isolated seniors.

One Senior Services volunteer has been making "lapghans", a small afghan blanket large enough to cover someone's lap. She has been donating approximately 15 lapghans per moth for the past several years. They are delivered to clients through the SSCI Nutrition Department. This volunteer states that it feels great to do something for those less fortunate than her, and it has given her a sense of purpose in retirement.

PROGRAMS & ACTIVITIES

- 10,647 seniors enjoyed various programs and activities at the Senior Center
- 255 seniors enjoyed travel opportunities.
